Real English: Frag 杀伤对手

- Neil: This is Real English from BBC Learning English. I'm Neil.
- Helen: And I'm Helen.
- Neil: Today we're going to look at words and phrases that have recently become part of the English language.

- Helen: Frag. Frag 是个什么东西？
- Neil: Well, frag is an expression from computer games. It means to kill your opponent.
- Helen: 这是一个电子游戏中特有的英语词，就是在游戏中杀伤对手的意思。
- Neil: Yes, you might say "I got to level 14 in Doom, but I kept getting fragged."
- Helen: 就是说你在游戏中总被对方杀死。
- Neil: That's right. Fragged means killed when playing a computer game.

Neil: I sometimes play with my brother, but he's much better than me and always frags me!

Helen: Really?

Helen: Oh dear!

Neil: Yes – I'm not very good at computer games.

Helen: So you keep getting fragged?

Neil: Yes, but luckily it's only a game!
